SPECIFICATION

Product Overview	The protein was expressed as 6*his-tagged fusion protein by E.Coli and purified by Ni-sepharose. The purified protein was resolved in 1M P BS (58mM Na ₂ HPO ₄ , 17mM NaH ₂ PO ₄ , 68mM NaCl, pH8.) added with 300mM Imidazole and 0.7% Sarcosyl, 15% glycerol

Description	Laminin subunit α -4 is a protein that in humans is encoded by the LAMA4 gene. Laminins, a family of extracellular matrix glycoproteins, are the major noncollagenous constituent of basement membranes. They have been implicated in a wide variety of biological processes including cell adhesion, differentiation, migration, signaling, neurite outgrowth and metastasis. Laminins are composed of 3 non identical chains: laminin α , β and γ (formerly A, B1, and B2, respectively) and they form a cruciform structure consisting of 3 short arms, each formed by a different chain, and a long arm composed of all 3 chains. Each laminin chain is a multidomain protein encoded by a distinct gene. Several isoforms of each chain have been described
Purity	purified by Ni-sepharose
Format	1M P BS (58mM Na ₂ HPO ₄ , 17mM NaH ₂ PO ₄ , 68mM NaCl, pH8.) added with 300mM Imidazole and 0.7% Sarcosyl, 15% glycerol.

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Storage

The protein is stored in PBS buffer at -20°C. Repeated freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.
