Product Overview	Recombinant Human butyrophilin subfamily 3 member A1(BTN3A1), transcript variant 1(NM_007048), with a His tag, was expressed in human cells.

Description	The butyrophilin (BTN) genes are a group of major histocompatibility complex (MHC)-associated genes that encode type I membrane proteins with 2 extracellular immunoglobulin (Ig) domains and an intracellular B30.2 (PRYSPRY) domain. Three subfamilies of human BTN genes are located in the MHC class I region: the single-copy BTN1A1 gene (MIM 601610) and the BTN2 (e.g., BTN2A1; MIM 613590) and BTN3 (e.g., BNT3A1) genes, which have undergone tandem duplication, resulting in 3 copies of each (summary by Smith et al., 2010 [PubMed 20208008]).
Form	Purified protein formulated in a sterile solution of TBS buffer, pH7.195, without any preservatives.
Molecular Mass	57.5 kDa
Endotoxin	Endotoxin level is < 0.1 ng/g of protein (<1EU /g)
Purity	>90% by SDS-PAGE gel and Coomassie Blue staining
Applications	Antigens, Western, ELISA and other in vitro binding or in vivo functional assays, and

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protein-protein interaction studies.
