Product Overview	Recombinant Human IL11RA protein(Ser24-Ala370), fused with Fc tag, was expressed in HEK293.

Form	Lyophilized from 0.22 µm filtered solution in PBS, pH7.4. Normally trehalose is added as protectant before lyophilization.
Bio-activity	Immobilized Human IL-11, His Tag at 5 µg/mL (100 µL/well) can bind Human IL-11 R alpha, Fc Tag with a linear range of 1-10 ng/mL.
Molecular Mass	This protein carries a human IgG1 Fc tag at the C-terminus. The protein has a calculated MW of 64.3 kDa. The protein migrates as 70-90 kDa under reducing (R) condition (SDS-PAGE) due to glycosylation.
Proteinlength	Ser24-Ala370
Endotoxin	Less than 1.0 EU per µg by the LAL method.
Purity	>90% as determined by SDS-PAGE.

Storage For long term, the product should be stored at lyophilized state at -20°C or lower. Please avoid repeated freeze-thaw cycles. This product is stable after at: -20°C to -70°C for 12 months in lyophilized state; -70°C for 3 months under sterile conditions after reconstitution.

Reconstitution It is recommended that sterile water be added to the vial to prepare a stock solution of 0.2 ug/ul. Centrifuge the vial at 4°C before opening to recover the entire contents.
