Product Overview	Recombinant Human CDCP1 (Q9H5V8-3) (Met1-Glu343) was expressed in HEK293, fused with Fc region of Mouse IgG1 at the C-terminus.

Form	Lyophilized from sterile PBS, pH 7.4. Normally 5 % - 8 % trehalose, mannitol and 0.01% Tween80 are added as protectants before lyophilization.
Molecular Mass	The recombinant human CDCP1/mFc is a disulfide-linked homodimer. The reduced monomer comprises 548 amino acids and has a predicted molecular mass of 61.4 kDa. The apparent molecular mass of the protein is approximately 89-93 in SDS-PAGE under reducing conditions due to glycosylation.
Endotoxin	< 1.0 EU per µg of the protein as determined by the LAL method.
Purity	> 90 % as determined by SDS-PAGE
Storage	Samples are stable for up to twelve months from date of receipt at -20°C to -80°C. Store it under sterile conditions at -20°C to -80°C. It is recommended that the protein be aliquoted for optimal storage. Avoid repeated freeze-thaw cycles.

Reconstitution

It is recommended that sterile water be added to the vial to prepare a stock solution of 0.2 ug/ul. Centrifuge the vial at 4°C before opening to recover the entire contents.
