Description	Interleukin 3 receptor, alpha (low affinity) (IL3RA), also known as CD123 (Cluster of Differentiation 123), is a human gene. The protein encoded by this gene is an interleukin 3 specific subunit of a heterodimeric cytokine receptor. The receptor is composed of a ligand specific alpha subunit and a signal transducing beta subunit shared by the receptors for interleukin 3 (IL3), colony stimulating factor 2 (CSF2/GM-CSF), and interleukin 5 (IL5). The binding of this protein to IL3 depends on the beta subunit. The beta subunit is activated by the ligand binding, and is required for the biological activities of IL3.
Molecular Weight	The predicted molecular weight of Recombinant Mouse IL-3 R α is Mr 61.0 kDa. However, the actual molecular weight as observed by migration on SDS Page is Mr 70-80 kDa.
State Of Matter	Lyophilized.
Purity	>90% by SDS Page and analyzed by silver stain.
Endotoxin	<0.1 ng per 1 g as determined by the LAL method.

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Storage And Stability

This lyophilized protein is stable for six to twelve months when stored desiccated at -20°C to -70°C. After aseptic reconstitution, this protein may be stored at 2°C to 8°C for one month or at -20°C to -70°C in a manual defrost freezer. Avoid Repeated Freeze Thaw Cycles.
