Product Overview	Active Recombinant Horse IL1b protein(Q28386)(63~247 aa), fused with N-terminal His tag, was expressed in E.coli.

Form	Lyophilized from sterile PBS, pH7.4, containing 0.01% SKL, 1mM DTT, 5% Trehalose and Proclin300.
Bio-activity	Interleukin 1 beta (IL-1 β) also known as leukocytic pyrogen, leukocytic endogenous mediator, mononuclear cell factor, lymphocyte activating factor and other names, is a member of the interleukin 1 family of cytokines. This cytokine is an important mediator of the inflammatory response, and is involved in a variety of cellular activities, including cell proliferation, differentiation, and apoptosis. It has been reported that IL-1 β can induced IL-8 production in A549 cells. To test the bioactivity of IL-1 β , A549 cells were seeded into 24-well plate at a density of 1×10^5 cells/mL, and allowed to attach overnight before treated with certain concentrations of IL-1 β for 24h and IL-8 levels in the cell supernatant were determined by ELISA.

Storage	Avoid repeated freeze/thaw cycles. Store at -20°C for 12 months. Aliquot and store at -80°C for 12 months.
Reconstitution	Reconstitute in 10mM PBS (pH7.4) to a concentration of 0.1-1.0 mg/mL. Do not vortex.

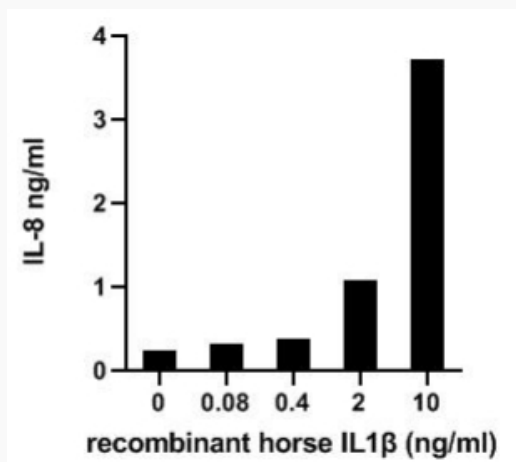
