Product Overview	Recombinant Bovine interferon-alpha was expressed in Yeast. MW=19.0kDa (166aa).

Description	The IFN- α proteins are produced by leukocytes. They are mainly involved in innate immune response against viral infection. They come in 14 subtypes that are called IFNA1, IFNA2, IFNA4, IFNA5, IFNA6, IFNA7, IFNA8, IFNA10, IFNA13, IFNA14, IFNA16, IFNA17, IFNA21. These genes for these IFN- α molecules are found together in a cluster on chromosome 9. IFN- α is also made synthetically as medication. Types are: Pegylated interferon alfa-2a ; Pegylated interferon alfa-2b.
Formulation/ Reconstitution	Lyophilized. Reconstitute with sterile phosphate-buffered saline containing at least 0.1% carrier protein.
Purification	Ion-exchange chromatography.
Purity	>95% as visualized by SDS-PAGE analysis.
