

Recombinant Human GP1BA, His-tagged, Single-sulfated

SPECIFICATION

Product Overview	Recombinant human GP1BA, fused with an C-terminal hexahistidine tag, was expressed in HEK293-EBNA1 cells. In the native protein the tyrosine residues at positions 292, 294 and 295 are sulfated. In this product one of the three tyrosines are sulfated.

Description	Glycoprotein Iba is part of the platelet receptor Glycoprotein Ib-XI-V complex. The Glycoprotein Ib-XI-V complex mediates binding of platelets to sites of vascular damage. This product consists of residues 17-306 of glycoprotein Iba and contains the binding sites for Von Willebrand Factor, thrombin and botrocetin. The two N-linked glycosylation sites , Asn37 and Asn175, have been removed by mutation to glutamine.
Form	PBS without preservative.
Molecular Mass	The calculated molecular weight is 33.5 kDa.
Storage	- 80 °C (stable for at least 1 year). After thawing it should be stored in appropriate small aliquots at - 20 °C or - 80 °C (stable for at least 2 months).
