Product Overview	Recombinant mouse ANT XR2, fused to His-tag at C-terminus, was expressed in insect cell and purified by using conventional chromatography techniques.

Description	ANTXR2, also known as anthrax toxin receptor 2, is a widely expressed anthrax toxin receptor family protein. The main functional domain of this protein is an extracellular integrinlike von Willebrand factor type A (VWA) domain with a metal ion dependent adhesion site, through which it adheres selectively to collagen type IV and laminin. This protein and the related protein ATR/TEM8 serve as receptors for the protective antigen of Bacillus anthracis.
Form	Liquid. In Phosphate Buffered Saline (pH 7.4) containing 10% glycerol.

Storage	Can be stored at +4centigrade short term (1-2 weeks). For long term storage, aliquot and store at -20Centigrade or -70Centigrade. Avoid repeated freezing and thawing cycles.
